## Perspectives in Social and Emotional Learning and Career Development: innovative research and promising practice

**Professor Dr. V. Scott H.. Solberg** from Boston University, U.S. will discuss the dimensions of Social Emotional Learning (SEL) and the impact on career development. He will present the results of an international research project on Social Emotional Learning and Career Development, acknowledged by the World Education Research Association (WERA) as International Research Network. The Romania's results of this international research project will be introduced by **Dr. Andreea Scoda**, researcher at the National Centre for Policies and Evaluation in Education (NCPEE) Bucharest, Romania. **Dr. Angela Andrei**, researcher at the NCPEE Bucharest, Romania will illustrate an example of good practice from Romania – 'Programmes and activities of counselling for the development of students' socio-emotional skills.
